Hi Chanrithy,

Thanks for your messages. No, this was not reported in the media. If it was, Hyde would probably not try to block the resolution. I learned of it from a congressional aide. If you and Loung (and Dith Pran ?) could write a joint letter to Hyde, he would know the letter could be published if he did not stop blocking the resolution, and so he might be persuaded to stop first, rather than face adverse publicity for letting the Khmer Rouge evade justice again. He would not like that kind of publicity; that's why a letter from survivors is so important. Hyde's suppression of the resolution depends on him getting away with it without public scrutiny. You can deprive him of the darkness he needs to carry out this deed.
