The House Concurrent Resolution in support of a Cambodia tribunal www.yale.edu/cgp/hcon399ih.html now has ten co-sponsors, 2 Republican and 8 Democratic congressmen. But the Republican committee chairman Henry Hyde is bottling it up in the House International Relations Committee, preventing the resolution from reaching the House floor for a vote. As you know, it is US law to support a Cambodia tribunal, and the State Department has already allocated \$4m. in funding for the UN administration of the tribunal, but the House International Relations Committee is now preventing the resolution from being discussed, and the funds are not being disbursed.

Anything you can do to enlist support for H. Con. Res. 399 would be effective and appreciated. I'm sure a letter from you two and possibly other Cambodian survivors of the genocide would make a big difference. Could you write a joint letter to the people listed below? Best wishes,
